Linnwood is a NSW State Heritage Listed house (1891) on five hectares at Guildford. The house will be open on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> April with a presentation on the story of Linnwood, together with displays of local and historic interest. Devonshire tea provided and visitors are free to roam the house and grounds. Plenty of parking on site.

Feel free to wander through this 1891 house, built on the 'grand' scale, and admire the stained and leadlight glass throughout.

## Connections to Linnwood

On display:

- Photographic display of:
  - Homes with a connection to the McCredie family.
  - Buildings in Sydney designed by George & Arthur McCredie, underground cable telephone tunnels, and leasing of granite quarries for their building works.
- Previous land holdings of some members of the McCredie family – including Susan McCredie (nee' Blackwood).
- In the McCredie Room, donations from members of the McCredie family.
- Rolling Powerpoint presentation – “The History of Linnwood” - as well as a photographic display of its story through the years.
- Photographic display of the early days of Guildford, including the Guildford Road Project – how the main thoroughfare has changed over the years.
- Display by Granville Historical Society.
- Scale model of the former Goodyear factory at Granville, with some history and photos.
